Massachusetts December 2021 Revenue Collections at \$4.235 Billion

The Massachusetts Department of Revenue (DOR) announced December 2021 revenue collections totaled \$4.235 billion, which is \$1.396 billion (49.2%) more than December 2020 and \$1.228 billion (40.9%) above monthly benchmarks.

FY22 year-to-date collections total \$17.846 billion, which is \$3.549 billion (24.8%) more than the same period of FY21, and \$2.142 billion (13.6%) more than year-to-date benchmark.

The DOR noted that the increased collections total was due to many pass-through entities paying the 2021 excise in December to claim a deduction on their 2021 federal return and should not be used as a predicator for the remainder of the fiscal year.
